1. My name is Mohamed Haneef and I am the applicant herein. I was born on

seven (27) years of age.
2. I am currently under investigation for, as I understand it, supporting a
terrorist organisation. I strongly deny any involvement in supporting terrorist
movements.

4. My wife, Firdous Arshiya, recently, gave birth to our daughter on the 26th day of June 2007, in India. My daughter's name is Haniyah Kulthum. My wife and daughter are currently residing in India with my Father and Mother in law.
5. I am an Indian citizen, qualified as a Doctor in Medicine. I completed my Bachelor of Medicine in April 2002 through Doctor B.R Ambedkar Medical College, Bangalore. After graduating, I commenced my internship at the same hospital in July 2002 and I completed the internship in July 2004. *HS*
6. I have worked in a number of hospitals in the United Kingdom. From July 2004 to August 2004, I worked in Halton General Hospital in Runcorn. At this hospital I was a clinical observer.
7. From September 2004 to October 2004, I worked at Warwick Hospital. I was also a Clinical Observer at this hospital.
8. I then returned to Halton Hospital where I again worked as a clinical observer from November 2004 to January 2005.
9. In August 2005, I began work at the Royal Liverpool University Hospital. At this Hospital, I was the Senior ^{House} ~~Health~~ *Officer* *HS*. I worked in the Acute Medical Unit, the Orthopedics Unit and the Intensive Care Unit. I held this position until around ^{August} ~~July~~ *2006*.

10. I returned to India where I decided to travel to Australia to commence my post-graduate training.
11. I am currently training to be a Physician and I am enrolled in the Australian College of Physicians for that purpose.
12. I arrived in Australia in September of 2006. My chosen post-graduate training runs for three (3) years. I have a Visa that is valid up to the year 2010.
13. My wife, initially, traveled to Australia with me. However, she returned to India in the middle of March 2007. My wife returned to India to allow our family to provide support during the birth of our child. We do not have any family or other support networks in Australia.
14. I was arrested on 2 July 2007 at the International Airport at Brisbane when I was attempting to visit my wife and new-born child in India. I intended to stay in India for a period of seven (7) days and then return to Australian to continue my work in Medicine.
15. I asked my Father-in-law, Ashfaq Ahmed, to purchase a ticket from Brisbane to India as I did not have enough money in my bank account to pay for it myself. It was my intention to purchase a return ticket to Australia once I had spent the seven (7) days with my family.

16. It has always been our intention for my wife and child to move to Australia after the child's birth and upon a passport being issued to our child. We expect this to take a month and a half from the date of our child's birth. My mother is also intending to live in Australia to provide support to my wife and me. My wife, mother and child are going to stay at our Southport address.

17. In relation to my long term plans, it has always been my intention to complete my post-graduate training and, upon completion, enroll in an advanced course as a Physician. This advanced course would then take me approximately four (4) to five (5) years to complete, depending on the area in which I choose to specialise. At the end of this period, my wife and I will then weigh up our options to either live here permanently or move abroad.

18. Any further detention will cause me great difficulties as I have a number of expenses that I am required to pay. If I am unable to attend work, I do not receive any income. Please see below a summary of my monthly expenses:

Rent
\$1000 per month in Australia (I also send a further \$1000 to India per month to support my family in their day-to-day living expenses).

Car expenses
\$470 per month
